First and foremost, I would like to commend the efforts of all those who have dedicated themselves to improving the quality of education in Tambra.

I understand that, since last year, World Vision Japan and World Vision South Sudan together have been working with local governments and communities not only to improve school facilities but also to promote life skills training to children, to enhance understanding on the importance of education among adult parents, and to provide training to teachers.

Today's school opening ceremony gives us an opportunity to appreciate all the positive outcomes that all of you collectively realized for the benefit of children, who bear responsibility for the future of this payam, county, state, or even the entire country. Congratulations to you all again!

Thanks to this new school facilities in front of you, pupils have become the greatest beneficiaries. The number of pupils in the school nearly doubled from 163 to 316 with the construction of the facilities. 8 classrooms, 1 teachers' room, 13 toilets and the fence, all improved the environment of daily education.

It is also my pleasure to hear that, with the support of the Government of Japan, which means, with the goodwill of the entire Japanese people, this education support program will continue in the next two years! Teachers will receive further training on a wide range of subjects, which will in turn benefit the pupils who receive instruction from these teachers. And they will then become fathers and mothers in the future, improving the quality of life in the next generation.

Allow me to conclude my message by conveying the wish of the Japanese people that we would like to extend support to those under the most difficult conditions in the country. Tambra is very far away from Juba, or even Yambio. Still, or rather for that reason, we care for you even more.
