



Japan extends \$25 million assistance for South Sudan's Peace and Development

Juba - Japan decided to provide a new assistance package of 25 million USD for South Sudan through partnership with international organizations.

The signing of the Revitalized Agreement for Resolution of Conflict in South Sudan (R-ARCSS) on 12th September is a milestone to achieve peace and stability in South Sudan and move towards the development of the country. After the signing, the ceasefire continues to hold in most parts of the country and the economic situations are improving. The successful implementation of the R-ARCSS is now critically important for the sustainable peace and stability in South Sudan.

However, it is estimated that more than 4 million South Sudanese, approximately one-third of its total population, are displaced and remains at dire humanitarian conditions. Almost 50% of populations are under food insecurity, while Humanitarian Response Plan 2019 estimated approximately 7 million people will need humanitarian assistance. There is also need for capacity building and development assistance in order to increase resilience of South Sudanese people. Therefore, Japan will continue to support, in partnership with the international community, the efforts towards peace and stability in South Sudan.
