In South Sudan, the Ministry offers and opens opportunities for the scholarship for Research Students (master's course, doctoral course or professional graduate course).

1 Qualifications and Conditions

- (1) South Sudanese national
- (2) Must be born on or after April 2, 1986
- (3) Academic background: refer to the application guideline
- (4) Physically and mentally sound
- (5) Willing to learn Japanese language and culture (must have the ability to do research and adopt to live in Japan)

2 Terms of Scholarship

- (1) Recipients whose Japanese language ability is insufficient shall attend designated Japanese language study course (for 6 months in general).
- (2) Fees pertaining to the entrance exam, matriculation, and tuition at the host university and fares for round-trip tickets will be covered by the Government of Japan.
- (3) Scholarship recipients must take an oath on a set of regulations prior to their dispatch

3 Documents for Application:

- (1) Application Form
- (2) Placement Preference Form
- (3) Field of Study and Research Plan
- (4) Certified grade transcripts for each academic year from the last school attended (the name of all courses attended and the earned grade for each course should be shown)
- (5) Certification of graduation or degree certificate of the university attended (If the applicant has not yet graduated, submit a certificate of prospective graduation from the university)
- (6) Letter of Recommendation from the president/dean or the academic advisor at the current or last university attended.
- (7) Medical certificate
- (8) Summary of theses (if the applicant has written theses)

- (9) Certificate of language proficiency (if the applicant has documents attesting to competency in Japanese or English)
- (10) Letter of Recommendation from the present employer (if the applicant is currently employed)
- (11) Three headshot photos, 4.5 cm x 3.5 cm
